Uniformed Public Services	now has a high proportion of females enrolling at all levels on what is traditionally a male orientated programme.
Senior Leadership Team	has overseen the strategic delivery of the Red Lion Quarter development in Spalding, offering employers and residents a state-of-the-art training facility on their door step.
Business & Computing	ensure International learners are 'buddied' with local learners to help with integration and cohesion.
Humanities	take International students on a range of visits to enable them to understand British culture and heritage.
Student Services	deliver outstanding services for students who require guidance, support and careers advice. In 2007 the College was awarded full Matrix Accreditation and was re-accredited in 2010, the first college to do so.
Maths	supported learners to enter the UK Senior Maths challenge where they achieved 1 Bronze, 7 Silver and 6 Gold certificates.
Boston Conference and Management Centre	hosted a Hate Crime Awareness conference attended by over 60 delegates from across Lincolnshire.
Human Resources	monitor staff data on aspects of their employment which allows Boston College to ensure all staff are treated fairly.
Boston College Student Union	developed and delivered student led tutorials on hate crime and bullying, supporting learner involvement.
Management Admin Team	ensure all of our documentation is standardised and available in alternative formats. They also support national and local charities on a voluntary basis by encouraging fundraising activities across our campuses.
Senior Leadership Team	has appointed a Chaplain to offer pastoral care to learners & staff using 'All faiths and None' approach.
Marketing	use effective communication through events, publications and media to reach out to learners and employers locally, regionally and internationally.
Motor vehicle	learners took part in the promotion of the Drink Drive Safety and Awareness campaign and carried out winter vehicle health checks for our staff.
Our Governors	invited groups of students to visit their businesses as part of student career development.
Quality	monitor data to allow the College to identify any complaints or compliments which may have an equality impact.
Corporate Management Team	has taken responsibility to equality impact assess all of our existing policies and procedures.
Business Development	has developed a community leadership training programme for a local housing association.
Care	were successful in gaining the Excellence Endorsement from the National Skills Academy allowing the College to become a Centre of Excellence for training in Adult Social Care.
Human Resources Strategy Group	encourages staff to influence and participate in Equality, Diversity and Inclusion activities including a staff visit to the Holocaust Memorial Centre.
Community Learning	provide courses for learners in remote rural areas through mobile provision and their learning centres.
Teaching Standards	ensure Equality, Diversity and Inclusion is judged in every lesson observation.
Foundation	deliver vocational subjects to their learners, teach them life skills and encourage independence ensuring they integrate within the College as a whole.
External Funding	secured £15,000 to deliver a 'Raising Aspirations' Equality, Diversity and Inclusion project.
Sport	in partnership with Boston United FC successfully work with disaffected young people.
