PART-TIME COURSES

Literacy and Numeracy

This diagnostic programme will assess the ability of the participant and determine which programme is most suitable. Each participant will receive a print-out of their results and individual guidance on what to do next.

ATTENDANCE: Approximately 1 hour.

Certificate in Adult Literacy and Numeracy

This City & Guilds qualification follows on from the Skills Check to develop the Literacy or Numeracy skills of the learner. Vocational equivalent to a GCSE, this course is tailored to individual needs and is ideal for anyone wishing to upgrade their CV with an English or Maths qualification.

ATTENDANCE: Day or evening, 5 to 30 weeks.
