Facilities For Careers Of The Future

We are continuously expanding our campuses to provide you with the very best opportunities for your career.

MAYFLOWER – NEW FOR 2024

An iconic building that will be an inspirational beacon for skills, enterprise and innovation in Boston. Supported by the Council through the Town Deal Fund, the project will connect local businesses, new thinking and the natural world, providing space for the town's economic relaunch.

DIGITAL TRASPOT AND LOGISTICS ACADEMY (DTLA)

Industry-standard digital equipment including mixed reality transport driver training simulator with platforms for heavy goods vehicle, car, forklift and bus. Electric and hybrid electric training rigs and vehicles, heavy goods vehicle training rigs, plus industrial robots and two computer suites for games development are also available.

INSTITUTTE OF TECHNOLOGY (IOT)

Facilities within the IOT include a graphic suite, electronics, robotics and programming rooms, hydraulics and pneumatics training equipment, a University Level seminar room, and a digital technology suite.

The Engineering, Manufacturing and Technology Centre (EMAT) also forms part of IOT, and includes facilities such as an innovation hub, engineering workshops, electronics laboratory and CAD/CAM suite.

MOTORSPORT WORKSHOP

Specialist motorsport facilities include two new workshops that are fully equipped with mechanical, electrical, and basic engineering equipment associated with building and maintaining competition-type vehicles, from karts to cars.

Boston College Racing Team (BCR) currently competes in the City Car Cup Student Motorsport Challenge in the College's own race car! These valuable resources will enable you to develop the technical knowledge and hands-on experience needed to pursue a career in this exciting industry.

SPORT, FITNESS AND WELLBEING LABORATORY

Dedicated University Level facilities where equipment includes Servomex 5200 Gas Analyser and Douglas bags for gas analysis, Tanita scales to assess a range of metrics, portable blood lactate analysis systems and a range of testing ergometers.

HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE CENTRE OF REGIONAL EXCELLENCE

An innovative, multi-functional training centre which includes an industry-standard clinical ward and a realistic working flat for social care. Study Programmes

Once enrolled at Boston College, you will engage in a study programme which is focused on developing your knowledge, skills and behaviours, for either going into employment or progressing to a higher level course, such as a degree.

Study programmes are personalised, full time study packages, available for earners aged 16-18 and are made up of four main parts:

1. **Main Qualification**
This is the course you have chosen to study, such as a Vocational Diploma or a set of A Levels. Explore the wide range of courses available for you to choose from, to meet your own personal interests.
2. **Work Experience**
As a central part of your study programme, you will complete a work experience placement, for an average of 30 hours, which is relevant to your course and overall career aspirations. Find out more about the benefits of work experience on the next page.
3. **English and Maths**
We understand the importance of English and maths in all aspects of your life, including the workplace. If you do not already hold a GCSE grade 4 or above in these subjects, you will be required to attend additional classes to support you to achieve these qualifications. The English and maths classes will fit around your full time course commitments, and the level at which you will study will depend on your current GCSE grade.
4. **Personal Development Opportunities**
Enrichment activities such as enterprise projects, tutorials, voluntary work, fundraising and external trips provide valuable learning beyond your qualification and will help to introduce you to other knowledge, skills and behaviours that you will need for your next steps and future career. These learning activities will also help you to stand out in the future when applying for university or employment.

STUDYING AN APPRENTICESHIP OR TRAINEESHIP?

Your training programme will consist of the following three aspects:

- College-based learning (off-the-job)
- Work-based training (on-the-job)
- English and maths development.

Work Experience

Work experience placements are an ideal opportunity for you to connect with employers and explore what it is like to work in your chosen sector.

In previous years, we have engaged with over 500 employers including multinational and local employers; some of our learners have even progressed into paid employment and apprenticeships as a direct result of their work experience placement.

By completing work experience you will:

- Be given the opportunity to apply the knowledge you have been acquiring in college to the workplace.
- Gain an appreciation of work attitudes and an understanding of the differences between college and work.
- Gain invaluable employment skills such as communication, teamwork, time management and customer service, which you can use to enhance your CV.
- In some cases, experience the application and selection process of gaining a job.

INDUSTRY PLACEMENTS

If you are aged 16–19 and studying a Level 3 course, you may have the opportunity to take part in a long-term work experience placement.

The placement must be relevant and meaningful for the study programme that you are on and will usually last an average of 315 hours over the academic year.

T-Levels

T Levels are new two-year Level 3 courses, available for those aged 16-18 years old, and are the equivalent to three A Levels. Endorsed by businesses, they bring together college learning and a 45-day industry placement with an employer to allow you to experience an industry while continuing your studies.

Backed by business – designed with leading businesses and employers to give you the knowledge, skills and behaviours you need for employment within your chosen sector or to progress onto higher level education.

T Levels are aimed at those learners who achieve at least five GCSEs at grade 4, including English and maths and have a strong interest in a specific course area (see individual T Levels for exact entry requirements).

T Levels are worth university points

A T Level distinction* is worth the same as three A Levels at A*, and is recognised by universities, so you can choose to continue at a higher level if you wish.

Industry placement

Develop practical and technical skills in a role directly relevant to a vocational course. Placements with external employers can be offered as a block, day release or a mix of these.

Assessment and grading

On completion of a T Level, you will receive a nationally recognised certificate with an overall grade of pass, merit, distinction or distinction* and a breakdown of what you have achieved.

Apprenticeships

What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a combination of on-the-job training in the workplace, and classroom or workshop-based learning at college. You will gain relevant job-specific skills from your employer and be supported through a nationally recognised qualification by specialist college staff, all while earning a wage. If you haven't already gained your English and maths qualifications up to Level 2, you will also work towards achieving them to help you progress towards your career plans and goals.

Your apprenticeship will consist of:

- College-based learning
- Work-based training
- English and maths development

Who can study an apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships are available to everyone, from those who are about to leave school and like the idea of getting straight into work, to those who are already working and need to secure a qualification to back up experience or change career completely.

How to become an apprentice

Step 1 – Think about your career options

Decide what industry you would like to train and work in. What are your career goals? See the full list of apprenticeships on pages **XX** and **XX**.

Step 2 – Choose an apprenticeship and apply online

Once you have chosen the industry you would like to work in and the apprenticeship you would like to study, you will then need to apply through the individual apprenticeship course page on our website at www.boston.ac.uk.

Step 3 – Find an employer

Finding a relevant apprenticeship employer is your responsibility, but our Apprenticeship Team is here to help. Once you have applied (Step 2), you will be contacted for an informal 'initial assessment' where a member of the team will discuss the apprenticeship in more detail and how we can help you to find an employer.

Apprenticeship FAQs

How old do I have to be?

You need to be at least 16 years old when you start your apprenticeship. There's no upper age limit – an adult can train as an apprentice too.

How much will I earn?

The current minimum wage for an apprentice is £5.28 per hour but employers can, and often do pay more. This rate applies to apprentices aged 16 to 18 and those aged 19 or over who are in their first year. Apprentices aged 19 or over and in the second year of their apprenticeship are entitled to the National Minimum Wage or National Living Wage dependent on their age.

Where will my apprenticeship be based?

Apprenticeships are based in the workplace and usually include one day a week at college. The college training will take place at either our Boston or Spalding Campus, however your apprenticeship employer and workplace does not need to be restricted to this location. Some apprenticeships are 100% work based. Find full course information online for further details.

What support will I receive?

During your apprenticeship you will receive support from your employer, your lecturers and assessors at Boston College. You will also have a dedicated Apprenticeship Coordinator who will support you and your employer throughout the apprenticeship journey.

How much will it cost?

As an apprentice, you won't pay any fees towards your training. However, you may want to buy books and stationery to support your learning.

Where do I start when searching for an apprenticeship job vacancy?

You will need to find a suitable apprenticeship job role that is linked to your chosen apprenticeship (ideally for a minimum of 30 hours per week). You can view current apprenticeship vacancies on our website www.boston.ac.uk/apprenticeships The Apprenticeship Team is also on hand to help match you to employer vacancies.

Traineeships

If you like the sound of an apprenticeship but would like to get more experience first, then a traineeship could be the starting point for you!

What is a traineeship?

Traineeships provide you with an opportunity to gain real work experience, alongside developing job skills and improving your English and maths qualifications (if necessary). The course programme is completed over a flexible period of six weeks up to one year, although most are completed within six months. The attendance is split between college-based lessons and a high quality work placement with a local employer.

Trainees can progress to an apprenticeship, employment or onto a full time course.

What are the benefits of a traineeship?

Along with developing the skills and experience that employers are looking for, a traineeship will also benefit you in the following ways:

- You will have the opportunity to develop your CV by adding valuable work experience and industry knowledge.
- By taking part in work preparation training, you will be putting yourself in a better position when competing for future apprenticeships or job vacancies.
- You will have access to English, maths and digital skills support, if necessary, which will over time improve your career prospects and long-term earning potential.
- By gaining work experience from a high quality work placement, you will be 'work ready' and have developed the confidence to take the first step towards an apprenticeship or employment.
- At the end of your traineeship, you will have the opportunity to be interviewed for a position within the company, if one is available.

University Level

FEES

If you are aged between 16–18 on the 31st August in the year you start your course, you will not have to pay any course tuition fees on full time courses – subject to meeting the eligibility criteria. If you are aged 19 or over on the 31st August in the year you start your course, fees will vary but some concessions may be available depending on your circumstances.

BURSARY FUND

The Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) provides the College with funds to support learners through the 16–19 Bursary Fund, 19+ Learner Support Fund and Loans Bursary Fund. Qualifying learners may receive financial support with college-related costs such as travel, food allowance, childcare, books, equipment and uniform.

ADVANCED LEARNER LOANS

If you are aged 19 or over studying a course at Level 3 or above you may qualify for an Advanced Learner Loan, which will help towards course fees. Similar to a student loan, there will be a repayment plan which will specify when and how much you pay. Household income is not taken into account and there is no credit check. Eligibility depends on the chosen course, nationality, and age. Discover more at www.gov.uk/advanced-learner-loan

STUDENT LOANS

Learners studying a University Level course are entitled to apply for a student loan through Student Finance England. The amount of the loan depends on individual circumstances. Find out more at www.gov.uk/studentfinance

HIGHER EDUCATION FINANCIAL SUPPORT SCHEME

The College may also be able to offer financial support for University Level learners to help them succeed and progress with their learning. To check the eligibility requirements, including partial fee waivers, please visit the Financial Assistance section of the Student Support page on our website.

HOME TO COLLEGE TRANSPORT

For those learners with a household income of less than £45,000 per year, that are studying at college for more than 12.5 hours per week, live more than 3 miles from the College and have submitted a bursary application*, the 16–19 Bursary will help with your transport costs. This may include a contribution towards a Lincolnshire County Council travel pass, public transport tickets or a mileage allowance (car/motorbike). Similar support is also available from the 19+ Learner Support Fund and Loans Bursary fund for qualifying learners.

WAITING FOR YOUR GCSE GRADES?

We know that if you are a school leaver you might not have your GCSE results by the time you apply. That's fine, just fill out the application form with your expected grades.

We are open on GCSE results day for information and advice, and you can come along to enrolment to discuss options if your plans have changed.

1. SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FORM

To apply for a course, simply submit an application form. Apply online at www.boston.ac.uk. Your application will be processed by the Admissions Team.

2. APPLICATION REVIEW

After your application has been received and processed, you will have an 'Application Review' with a member of staff from your chosen course area. The Application Review will give you the chance to discuss the course in more detail and decide which level of study is right for you – it's a great way of getting to know the College and staff.

3. YOUR PLACE

Following your Application Review, you will be sent a letter stating one of the following:

- A conditional offer
- Offer of a guidance session

4. LEARNER INDUCTION DAY

Your Induction Day in June is the final stage of your application before enrolment in August. This is your opportunity to meet your course tutor and other members of College staff, take part in hands-on activities, familiarise yourself with the College campus and get to know other learners on your course.

5. ENROLMENT

Once you have accepted your course offer, you will receive a letter in August inviting you to enrol on a certain date and time. It will provide you with all the information you need to be able to enrol at College. Enrolment usually takes place at the end of August onwards, with the overall process taking around two hours. Once enrolment has been completed and you have your ID badge, you are an official Boston College learner!
