Qualifications **Explained**



These are Level 4 and Level 5 qualifications, such as Foundation Degrees, Higher National Certificates and Higher National Diplomas. They are an option for school leavers starting their career and for adults looking to upskill or retrain.

HTQs have been approved against employer developed standards, also known as occupational standards. This ensures that you gain the skills that employers want, and employers can be confident that you have the knowledge, skills and behaviours for a particular specialist role.

Higher National Certificate (HNC)

An HNC is the equivalent to the first year of university (Level 4) and takes one year to complete.

Once you have completed your HNC, you can either go straight into employment or you can study one more year to convert your qualification into a Higher National Diploma (HND).

Higher National Diploma (HND)

An HND is equivalent to two years at university (Level 5). A Level 5 HND is a two year course. During your first year, you will study a Level 4 HNC.

Successful completion of the HNCs and HNDs provide the opportunity to 'top-up' with a further year of study at Boston College or university to achieve a full Bachelor's Degree, or enter full time employment.

Foundation Degree (FdA)

Foundation Degrees take two years to complete and are equivalent to the first two years of a Bachelor's Degree. Upon completion of your Foundation Degree you will have the opportunity to 'top-up' your degree with a further year of study at Boston College or university.

Degree Top-Ups BA (Hons)/BSc (Hons)

If you have previously completed a relevant Level 5 qualification, such as an HND, FdA, or HTQ you can top up your existing qualifications to achieve a full honours degree. This Level 6 degree top-up is equivalent to the final ye ar of undergraduate study



Important Information

Entry Qualifications

Academic qualifications are equated to UK entry requirements using the UK NARIC qualifications database to ensure academic quality.

For students outside the EU, academic qualifications are assessed on an individual basis by the subject area's academic coordinator.

Original copies of qualifications will need to be seen as part of the entry criteria. You must also meet the minimum English Language requirement which is IELTS 6.0, or be able to evidence the equivalent for undergraduate degree level.

Applications - University of Derby Approved Courses

All applications are subject to approval by the University of Derby (UoD). In order for the University to approve your application we are required to share your personal information. This includes sharing the application form that you have completed to study this course, and in some instances, copies of your maths, English and highest-level qualification certificate. Your offer to study with us will be conditional as all applications are to be approved by the University of Derby.

You can apply for a student loan to cover the costs of course fees. You may also be able to apply for various grants and loans to support your learning. 



During your first year, you will complete the Level 4 aspects of the course. You will gain a wide range of business knowledge tied to practical skills gained through research, independent study, directed study and workplace scenarios.

You will learn transferable skills such as communication, teamwork, research and analysis, which are highly valued in higher education and the workplace. By the end of Level 4, you will have sound knowledge of the basic concepts of leadership and management.







The Public Services HND Level 5 is the equivalent to the first two years of a University Degree and provides a specialist programme of study that covers the skills required to be successful in uniformed and non-uniformed Public Services.

DURATION

2 Years

This course will enhance your potential for employment through having a greater understanding of roles within various services such as the prison service, criminal justice system, emergency services and the military.

The course will explore criminal behaviour, mental health and wellbeing, organisation structures, crime reduction strategies and effective coaching and mentoring strategies to provide essential understanding for a range of the diverse opportunities available in the Public Services sector.

- MMP profile (minimum 80 new UCAS points) other related level qualifications such as an Access to Higher Education diploma are also accepted.
- You will also need a GCSE grade 4 or above (C) in English and Maths (e.g. GCSE or Functional Skills) and/or minimum IELTS score 6.
