



- Personal Guidance Delivering tailored, one-to-one career guidance from qualified professionals to support students' aspirations and next steps.


WHAT CAN STUDENTS EXPECT FROM THE CAREERS TEAM?


Moving to the Careers Team has led to me studying my qualification to become a fully qualified Careers Adviser.


My role involves supporting students on their next steps, career pathways and with their short and long term goals.


